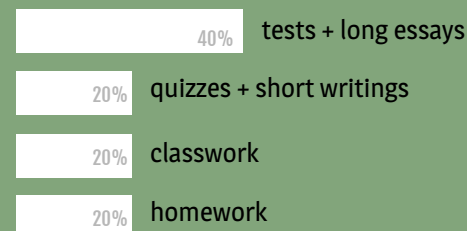

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE

Attendance and participation are required. It is your responsibility to find out what work you have missed if absent. You have one day for each day missed to submit the work. After that, late work has to be made up after school.

LATE WORK

Late work will be accepted for 100% credit for up to one week after it is due and has to be made up after school. If the work is still not submitted after one week, the assignment will receive a zero.

GRADING

I grade using a scale of 0-4 based on level of mastery. Numerically, scores are as follows:

4 = 95

3 = 85

2 = 75

1 = 65

0 = 55 (if assignment is attempted)

0 = 0 (if not attempted/all wrong)

The remaining 5% of points are based on the TAG PREPP traits.

HONESTY

Cheating and plagiarism will not be tolerated in any form. Any assignment that is proven to be the work of anyone other than the student will be given a zero.

TECHNOLOGY

Students are permitted to use school-issued laptops only in class. No smartphones or other devices are allowed. Students who abuse these privileges will have them revoked.

PREPARATION

Students are expected to be prepared for class each day. That means:

- Your laptop is charged
- You have writing utensils including pens, pencils, and highlighters
